6. Purpose:

The National Certificate Level 5 Nursing- Nursing Assistant is designed as an outcomefocused course that combines academic study with practical experience to build the broad
skills and competencies needed for this role. The programme integrates work-based
learning through strong partnerships between employers and education providers. While
trainee Assistant Nurses are primarily employed to function within one organisation and
setting, they will also have the opportunity to work in other more complex health
environments under the supervision of registered nurses. The trainees will learn about the
basics of nursing care such as patient care, hygiene management, vital sign monitoring and
administering basic medical assistance amongst other.

Upon completion, holders of the qualification will be well-prepared to provide support and work with registered nurses, doctors, and other medical staff in delivering patient care.

7. Qualification pathways:

Upon completion of the programme, learners will be able to follow the National Diploma Level 6 in Nursing.
